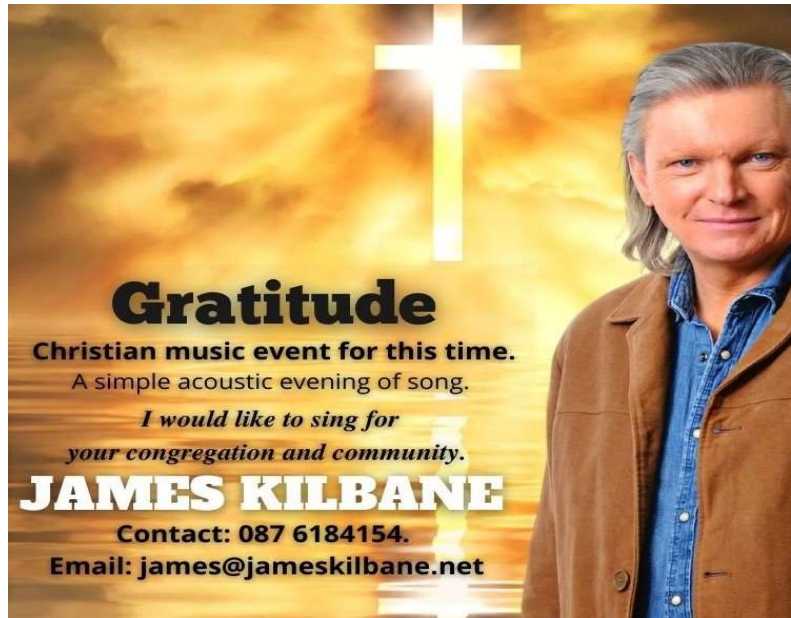

Pentecost Sunday (Next Sunday) designated as Day of Prayer in Thanksgiving for the Diocesan Phase of the Universal Synod.

Pentecost Sunday, offers us all an opportunity to give thanks for the prayerful engagement and listening that has taken place across the country as we journey together synodally.

Work of Synthesis underway for Synodal Process.

As local listening processes have been undertaken in our Parish as well as globally, Dr Nicola Brady, Chairperson of the Steering Committee of the Irish Synodal Pathway, explained in the June issue of 'Intercom' Magazine that the term 'Synod' comes from the Greek for 'together on the way'. Synodality is a way of being Church. It is a spiritual practice and not just a debate about how the Church is organised. It is intended to facilitate a wide ranging process of reflection and discernment. Dr Brady emphasised that all the faithful are invited to take part in the Synodal Pathway.

Following completion of the listening process and the subsequent synthesising of the findings at diocesan level, A National Pre-Synodal Assembly will take place in Athlone on June 18th with a closing liturgy in Clonmacnoise, before the final submission to the Vatican.
