Pope Francis invited the world to pray for Peace to stop the Ukraine crisis from worsening.

Pope Francis on Sunday called for last Wednesday 26th January to be an international day of "prayer for peace" to stop the Ukraine crisis from worsening. Pope Francis said: 'the tensions were threatening the security of Europe and risking vast repercussions'.

Pope Francis announced the prayer day and made the appeal for dialogue to defuse the crisis during his weekly address and blessing to pilgrims and tourists in St. Peter's Square Rome.

He said: "I am following with concern the rising tensions that threaten to deliver a new blow to peace in Ukraine and put the security of Europe in doubt, with even more vast repercussions," he said.

Pope Francis invited "all people of good will" to pray, so that all political initiatives "be for the service of human fraternity" rather than partisan interests.

"Those who pursue their interests by damaging others are in contempt of his vocation as a man, because we were all created as brothers," he said, without elaborating.

## Tuesday: 1st February – Feast of St Brigid.

St Brigid is renowned for her hospitality, almsgiving and care of the sick. She was born 454AD. When she was young her father wished to make a very suitable marriage for her but she insisted in consecrating herself to God. She received the veil and spiritual formation probably from St Mel and stayed for a period under his direction in Ardagh. Others followed her example and this led her to found a double Monastery in Kildare with the assistance of Bishop Conleth. She died in 524AD and her cult is widespread not only throughout Ireland but in several European lands. The St Bridget's Cross, in legend used by Brigid to explain the Christian faith remains a popular sign of God's protection. Traditionally the St Brigid's cross is placed in the home seeking Brigid's intercession on the home. Also traditionally the St Brigid's Cross is placed in the barn seeking protection on the farm animals and on the farms crops for the year ahead.



### Wednesday: 2nd February – The Presentation of the Lord.

This Feast is a remembrance of the Lord and Mary, mother of the Lord. With candles in their hands, the people go out to meet the Lord and to acclaim him like Simeon, who recognized Christ as ' a light' to reveal God to the nations'.

#### **Blessing of Throats:**

Bishop McKeown has asked that mindful of standing over the people to be blessed for a period of time uttering a prayer during this pandemic year that instead a general blessing of throats be administered rather than individual blessings of the throat. The blessing of St Blaise is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick. Using two crossed and unlighted candles, blessed on the memorial of St Blaise or on the Feast of The Presentation of the Lord, the minister touches the throat of his person saying: 'Through the intercession of St Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from all ailments of the throat and from every other evil (or from every disease of the throat and from every other illness). In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.'

### Thursday: 3rd February – Feast of St Blaise.

St Blaise died 315AD. Bishop of Sebaste, martyred in Armenia. Tradition states that he was a physician before becoming a bishop.
